Facts about TURKEY

- The world's oldest settlement discovered, catalhoyuk, is located in Central Anatolia and dates since year 6500 BC
- St.Nicolas-Santa Claus-was born in Patara located within Turkey's borders, and has a church named after him at Demre.
- Virgin Mary spent her last days in a place located near the ancient city Ephesus, in Selcuk.
- «Veni,Vidi,Vici»(I came, I saw, I conquered):these famous words of Julius Caesar were said after his great victory over the Kingdom of Pantus that was located in the Turkish Black Sea region.
- Homer was born in İzmir, Turkey's western coast, and in the Iliad he descried
 Troy that was situates in north to his birthplace.
- A part of the south-western coast of Turkey was given as a wedding gift to Cleopatra by Marcus Antohious.
- The famous Trojan Wars took place in Turkey's west side, now an imposing wooden statue of trojan horse marks the region in which it took place.
- Two of the seven wonders of the earth are located in Turkey; one of them is the Temple of Artemis, and the other is the Mausoleum of Halicarnassus.
- Anatolian Peninsula is the birthplace of many historical characters:Phrygian King Midas, the father of history Herodotus and St. Paul.
- The first man who successfully managed to fly wad Turkish. In the 17th
 Century Hezarfen Ahmet Celebi, with the help of two wimgs flew from the
 Galata Tower passed the strait and landed in Üsküdar.
- First known beauty contest was held in Anatolia the competitors were Aphrodite, Hera and Athena by the arbitration of Paris.
- The word «Turquoise» has its roots from the word «Türk»,the Mediterranean
 Sea at the south of Turkey with its fascinating color owes its discovery.



3.2. The City: DİDİM

- ➤ Didim, home of the antique city of Didyma with its ruined Temple of Apollo, is a small town, popular seaside holiday resort and district of Aydın Province on the Aegean coast of western Turkey, 123 km (76 mi) from the city of Aydın.
- Didim is located on the north shore of the gulf of Güllük opposite the Bodrum peninsula villages such as Torba, Türkbükü and Yalıkavak. The district consists of Didim itself, a coastal town of 26,000 people and a number of small towns including Altınkum (which means golden sand), Gümüşkum (silver sand) and Sarıkum (yellow sand).
- Tourism is the main source of income for the area, especially in summer, but agriculture is also an important contributor, the main crops are wheat and cotton. Animals, especially sheep and goats, are raised mainly for local consumption.
- The ruins of the Ionic Temple of Apollo with its columns pointing up into the sky and its legend of the romance between Apollo and Daphne is nearby. The original temple and home of an oracle was destroyed during the Persian Wars and the one we see today was rebuilt following the victory over the Persians of Alexander the Great.
- Miletos, the ruins of the ancient city including a well-preserved antique theatre, stadium, baths of Faustina, temple of Serapis and much more.
- Didyma was the largest and most significant sanctuary on the territory of the great classical city Miletus. To approach it, visitors would follow the Sacred Way to Didyma, about 17 km long. Along the way, were ritual waystations, and statues of members of the Branchidae family, male and female, as well as animal figures. Some of these statues, dating to the 6th century BC are now in the British Museum, taken by Charles Newton in the 19th century.



3.3. Turkish Currecy and Some Prices

- ❖ Out local currency is "Turkish Lira", TL. 1 Euro is approximately 3 TL
- If you need, you can change your money in banks and in exchange offices.
- Banks open from Monday to Friday from 9am to 5pm with one hour of break during noon. On Saturday and Sunday banks are closed and they can exchange money at lower prices.
- You can also find exchange agencies in everywhere and most of them open 7 days/week from 8am to 7pm.
- ❖ By the way, the better choice will be to take EURO or US Dollars with you so everywhere you can change them easily, sometimes at lower prices. You can also exchange money at the airport upon arrival at the PTT or bank window, located just before the exit of the airport, but it is useful to arrive with at least a small amount of lira in case the exchange window is closed at the time of arrival.
- Approximately, everywhere you can use your credit card; the most important credit cards are accepted: VISA, MasterCard and American Express.

4. How to arrive in Didim?

4.1. By Plane:

There is no airport at the resort. The airports close by are in Bodrum, Izmir and Dalaman. The distances of airports are: Izmir Adnan Menderes Airport 150km, Bodrum Airport 95km. Dalaman Airport 300km.approximately The nearest airport to Didim, "Bodrum Airport" is about 95 km south east of Didim which means 60 minutes of journey by road. The second nearest airport to Didim, "Izmir Adnan Menderes Airport" – amongst the most qualified airports of Turkey with its capacity and facilities, is about 95 km away from Didim. Including Turkish National Airlines, many accredited international airlines have regular direct and connected flights from and to international Izmir Adnan Menderes Airport.

4.2.By Bus:

Didim has bus connections with all major cities and touristic resorts of the country. They generally offer the choice of a day or night trip and a free transfer from city center to the bus station. A very comfortable and relaxing way to discover the different landscapes of the country while heading for your next stop.

4.3.By ship:

Didim is accessible from the Greek island Samos via Kusadasi and Kos via Bodrum, The cruise ships usually sail from Venice or Piraeus, daily from April 1st till October 31st (two-hours' journey). The harbor of Kusadasi is one of the biggest port of Turkey, visited by well-known cruise companies.

Accommodation will be in a hotel in Didim.

5.2. Fee

- Fee is 40 euros. But it changes according to your country category.
- Deposit paid to your own LBG isn't the fee.
- You will pay the fee here when you arrive in Turkey.
- Fee covers accommodation and 3 meals per day. However it does not cover other activities(Alchohol during parties etc). We will inform you about the extra fee (20-25 euros) for the parties like cantus or pub crawl during the course.
